6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

Vision of the Institution:

The institution envisions moulding of students who have humanitarian views, scientific approaches and are firm believer in positive social change. Such inspired youth will uphold the human values of liberty, equality and fraternity, and also shoulder the responsibilities of taking nation to greater heights.

Mission of the Institution:

- 1. To give advantage but affordable education so that the poorest of the poor students can avail it
- 2. To promote marginalised students towards professional courses and all round personality development.
- 3. To create environment of research through various training programmes, class, assignments, workshop, seminars and projects.
- 4. To undertake different educational programme and projects jointly with other institute for the benefit of students. Promote and stimulate students to become responsible citizen and entrepreneurs.

The mission of the institution is to provide an opportunity of education to the poorest of the poor. Therefore right from the admission process to academic teaching this mission is focused upon.

The mission and vision are continuously communicated to students, teachers, and staff through various academic, extracurricular and extension activities. An effort is taken to involve the parents through parent-teacher meet and many annual programmes like Vyakhyan Mala (Lecture Series) on death anniversary of Dr. Ambedkar have been organized since the inception of the college. 6.2 Does the Institution has a management Information System

The institution does not have an MIS. Though the working of Administrative Office and Library is fully computerised

- 6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:
 - 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The curriculum design for BA and B Com courses is done as per the directives of the University. Many faculty members of the following departments namely Economics, Hindi, English, Marathi and Commerce are part of the task force formed by the university after the Board of Studies. Many books on the University syllabus are edited by our college faculty. From the next session the UG courses of RTM Nagpur University are being changed to semester pattern. Nearly 8 faculty members have been directly involved in bringing about this change at the University level.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Many quality improvement strategies have been adopted by various teaching departments in an effort to upgrade knowledge quotient of the students and improve the results. Many short term courses were organized by Department of English through its language lab. The Remedial Coaching Cell of the college also continuously takes classes to improve students in the subjects like Economics, English and Commerce. Department of English and Hindi have movie clubs to enhance perception of the students.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination is held as per university norms. Classroom evaluation is done as per Unit Tests, Prelims, are conducted for each class. Teachers play an important role in University exams as paper setters, evaluator and as coofficers for other examination centres. The college also is one of the biggest centers of Nagpur University. For nearly three months University level exams are conducted by the teachers of the college. Nearly the whole of the senior college teaching staff are involved with the evaluation process of the University as examiners and moderators.

6.3.4 Research and Development

Research is an important criterion for quality improvement for teachers and students. On the level of students various research activities are conducted. For UG students research projects are taken up by different departments. On PG level assignments and research papers are made compulsory as part of the course. The institution also has two Research Centres for Pali and Dr. Ambedkar Thought. These centres also have JRF and Research Fellows attached to them.

On the level of teachers a very well equipped library is at their disposal. Eight faculty members are recognized Ph.D. Supervisors. An Interdisciplinary Research Journal *"Perspectives"* and an Annual peer reviewed Research Journal of English *"Cenacle"* is also published.

These journals provide avenues of publication for teachers.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The institution has one of the biggest libraries of North Nagpur. It has a large collection of literature in Marathi, Buddhist thought and Dr. Ambedkar Thought. The library is regularly upgraded. Documentation is done through software. The library also runs the UGC granted Network resource centre. It helps students to download e-resources'.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The Faculty members and non-teaching staff are sent to courses for upgradation of knowledge, various seminars and lectures are organized to make them aware of various new developments

Career up gradation is done by regular on campus and off campus placements.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

Recruitment on any level is as per UGC norms and University guidelines. The recruitment is regularly done as per vacant posts. A proper process is followed under the purview of expert committee in appointing new faculty.

6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

There are some MoUs with few local industries which allow students to do internship.

Department of Commerce and Economics have MoUs with local industries which provide training through Employment and Placement Cell like Jet King and Acquaguard.

On campus and off campus recruitments have considerably increased this year.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

The admission process is simple and first come first basis. Nearly 2500 and more students take admission in UG and PG courses.

The institution is an affiliated college, therefore all the Examination Reforms are implemented through the University. Many faculty members are on Board of Studies, Examination committees etc. They give regular suggestion for changes required in Examination.

The institution takes up some welfare programmes like cleanliness, drug awareness etc. in areas where large number of students resides.

The support staffs are very few and employed temporarily in number. Therefore nothing separately is done for them.

The institution regularly takes efforts to contribute towards rejuvenation of the environment through its Environment Cell. Tree plantation is taking up on different levels.
