Clean drinking water was available in the college campus, and the college building/classrooms were accessible to disabled persons. The campus had adequate power supply (generator, inverters, etc.). The functioning of the Placement cell in the college is satisfactory because the college took continuous efforts to improve the quality of teaching-learning and strengthen its ties with industries, professional bodies, etc. The College were promoting students exchange, internship etc. programmes for providing new opportunities to students.
