

About People's Welfare Society and the College

Dr.Madhkarrao Wasnik P.W.S. Arts and Commerce College located at Kamptee road, Nagpur completed 50 years of its journey of academic excellence in 2018 being one of the oldest colleges affiliated to R.T.M.Nagpur university in the central India. The college celebrated its Golden Jubilee as a grand function in January 2019 in the august presence of Shri. Nitinji Gadkari, Union Minister, Government of India being the chief Guest of the function.

"Educate ,Organize and Agitate" was a dynamic message given by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar to all the deprived classes for their social development . After the Conversion of Buddhism in 1956 there was an upsurge of revolution of Ambedkarism in the nation. Education is the only source for the upliftment of the depressed and oppressed class and I owe something to society; following these ideals Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik established the People's Welfare Society in 1967. The visionaries like Dr. Balraj Aher, Justice R. R. Bhole, Shri. A.D. Meshram, Dr. Sankale and Shri. Wamanrao Gedam fathomed the acute need of higher education facilities in the north Nagpur and it was only due to their foresightedness that Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik P.W.S. College was established in 1968 near Indora Square at Kamptee road with a few students in this area. Since the establishment the college has brought social awakening among its neighbouring locality and has helped a lot to build the career and prosper their lives to the students from marginalized society living in this North region. The People's Wefare Society enlarged its scope and established another centre of higher education in Kalmeshwar in Nagpur district under the name Indira Gandhi Arts and Commerce College in 1984 to facilitate the opportunities of higher education to the rural students. Keeping in mind the acute need of advanced English learning for children in this area the Peoples Welfare Society also took initiative to start a CBSC Public School in 2014-15 entitled as Nagpur Public School to provide hitech education in affordable expenses.

The college first won the Nagpur University Hockey Championship in 1972 under the stewardship of Dr. Balraj Aher, the former Registrar of R.T.M. Nagpur University the foundation Principal of the college and Prof. Narvariya, the then teacher in the Department of Physical Education. Since then a strong tradition of Sports, National Service Scheme, National Cadet Corps, and Extra-curricular activities exists. The considerable number of students of the college regularly feature in the University Merit Lists for their academic excellence and also bring laurels in sports and extra-curricular activities. The college hosted the first Akhil Bhartiya Dalit Sahitya Sammelan in 1976 under the able guidance of Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik along with Dr. Yashwant Manohar and Dr. Bhau Lokhande. The college has National Service Scheme Unit of 200 volunteers which is one of the oldest National Service Scheme Unit of the R.T.M. Nagpur University which has made its mark on the face of the times with their state and national level achievements.

The college NSS unit always documents a huge students participation in A Dhamma Sandesh from Dikshabhoomi, a social Champaign held on Every Dhamma Chakra Pravartan Din since last decades. The college has a big institutional library being one of the biggest libraries in the North Nagpur with a vast collection of 46,543 books on various subjects to quench the thirst of knowledge of the students. The college campus is fully Wi-Fi along with a big ICT lab to enhance the global competence of the students.







With the trust and co-operation from its learners the small sapling which was planted by Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik in 1968 has now turned into a gigantic tree in the form of a big Campus at kamptee road, catering to the needs of education and employment of the poor and backward students in this region. It provides multi facilities to its learners, a big building with spacious class rooms, digital class rooms, Ph.D. Research Centre, well equipped library with separate reading rooms for students, staff and Research scholars, a big computer lab, language lab, modern gymnasium, Siddharth Auditorium for academic deliberations and cultural activities, big play ground, canteen and a lush green beautiful garden. Till the date, the college has contributed to the university with more than 40,000 skilled graduates and post graduates who have added feathers in the cap of institution with their achievements in academics, sports, NSS, NCC and cultural wings. A large number of alumnae are working in various fields as high rank government officials and are acknowledged as renowned artists, industrialists and businessmen in India and abroad. Since its establishment, the college has been pioneer in various social movements and has played a pivotal role in enhancing the intellectual prosperity of the poor and needy. Till the date the college has efficiently faced three NAAC assessment cycles and it has been reaccredited with B+ by NAAC for its academic achievements in its third cycle in 2017.



The college documents a huge students participation in Dhamma Chakra Pravartan Day food Donation Programme and other community help services.

(A) Curricular Activities

- Bridge Courses: Since students from Arts and Science background also take admission to Commerce courses
 the college conducts, at the beginning of each session, some Bridge courses in subjects like Accountancy and
 Economics to familiarize the non-Commerce students with the Commerce stream.
- Remedial Coaching: The college also conducts remedial courses for the poor performing students, who are

Discipline and Conduct

Important instructions for the Students to Maintain the Academic and Educational Environment in the Institution

Dates of Submission of Scholarship and Concession forms:

Students have to strictly follow the schedules for submitting scholarship/freeship forms both manually and online. The college will not bear responsibility of those who do not submit the forms in time.

Note: It is to be noted by all students applying for Scholarships / freeships / concessions etc. that mere submission of Scholarships / freeships / concessions form does not amount to the claim of Scholarships / freeships or any concessions. Their forms will not be forwarded to the concerned department if they do not fulfill the mandatory condition of minimum 75% attendance in all subjects during the semester/ session.





Rules and Regulations for Students

 Each student must report to the college in the prescribed uniform and wear without fail the identity card. A student without Uniform and Identity Card will not be allowed inside the premises.

Students must remain present in their respective classes at the prescribed timings.

- It is mandatory for all students to have minimum 75% attendance in every subject in order to be eligible for appearing in the University/ Board Examinations. Students not fulfilling this condition will be detained from appearing in the Examinations. In case a student has to remain absent for long period for whatever reasons, he or his parent/guardian must intimate the college in writing and seek prior permission for the intended absence.
- All students of both Junior and Senior College are required to appear for all unit tests/ terminal examinations, vivavoce, and also submit, whenever required, home assignments, projects etc. for their internal assessment.
- It is mandatory for students to complete their coursework including unit tests/terminal examination/home assignments/projects etc. The students failing to comply with the above will have to pay the fine as imposed by the authorities.
- Students are to note that Internal Assessment marks are given on the basis of attendance, performance in test
 examinations, home assignments, viva-voce, discipline and participation/performance in the college activities.
- All students must participate in extra-curricular activities like NCC or NSS or Sports or other events organized by the College/University from time to time. Students get incentive marks for their participation in such activities.
- It is mandatory for students to appear for the Physical Efficiency Test and Medical Check-up/Test conducted by the
 college/University. Those who fail to appear in these tests will have to pay fine of Rs.ioo/- for each test.
- Elections for sending a representative to the University Students Council shall be held as per the provisions and directives from RTM Nagpur University.
- There shall be no Annual Social Gathering/College Day Celebrations. Only those activities/ events/ programmes which are approved by the College/Universitywill be organized.
- Students are expected to maintain a quiet and congenial atmosphere in the college. Any student disturbing the atmosphere shall be liable for strict disciplinary action including suspension/expulsion.
- When teaching work is going on, loitering in corridors, individually or in groups, is strictly prohibited. In case of off
 periods, students are advised to spend time in the Library/ Reading Room.
- Students shall not bring or invite their friends to college. Such visitors may be prosecuted for trespassing.
- Students are not allowed to use smart phones in the college. Students shall also not use mobile phones while in classrooms/ college library/and offices. While on campus, students must keep their phones on silent mode. Any student found using the smart phone or talking on phone in classroom/library/lab/corridors will have to pay the fine of Rs. 500/-. In case of emergencies, the parents can contact on 0712- 2653711/ or leave message on 08788614841 with details of student's name, section and the nature of emergency etc.
- d to be indulging in activities which are not in the interest of the college and which are detrimental to the smooth functioning of the college shall be expelled.
- Every student shall make proper use of college buildings, furniture, equipment, electricity/water and other facilities. Any student found guilty of causing damage or disfigurement to the college property, or found guilty of sticking posters on walls, or writing unwarranted things on the blackboards, will be straightway expelled, and the cost of damage to property will be recovered from him. Other general losses and damage to the college property shall be assessed at the end of the session and recovered from students of all classes collectively.
- All important notices, instructions etc. are put up on the College Notice Boards/ College website. Students should
 make a habit of visiting the Notice Boards/website regularly for important instructions and announcements.
- No student shall approach the Print or Electronic media for matters pertaining to the college without prior approval of the Principal. Any breach of this rule will lead to an outright expulsion of the concerned student.
- A student suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall not attend college. He/she will report only after declared medically fit, and on production of Medical Fitness Certificate by a Registered Physician.
- Students should inform the college authorities in writing about any change in permanent or local address, or phone number.
- Consumption of alcohol, smoking, chewing tobacco, or consuming tobacco related products on campus is strictly
 prohibited. Students indulging in the same will be fined and, if necessary, expelled from the college.
- Ragging or similar such act causing physical or mental agony to fellow students will be treated as a criminal
 offence and students found to be indulging in the same will be liable for prosecution.
- · Sexual Harassment in any form will not be tolerated and those involved shall be liable for prosecution.
- Students also shall not engage in any act of discrimination against fellow students on the basis of caste, gender, creed, colour, race, religion, place of birth, political conviction, language, and disability.

(No cases of Ragging or Sexual Harassment or Discrimination etc. have been reported during the last academic session.)

The above rules are subject to change, modification, addition, omission, or alteration as and when the authorities deem it fit and proper. The decision of the Principal in this regard will be final and binding on all students.
