About People's Welfare Society and the College

Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik P.W.S. Art's, Commerce & Science College located at Kamptee Road, Nagpur completed 54 years of its journey of academic excellenc in 2022 being one of the oldest colleges affiliated to R.T.M. Nagpur University in the central India. The college celebrated its Golden Jubilee as a grand function in January 2019 in the august presence of Shri Nitinji Gadkari, Union Minister, Government of India being the cheif guest of the function.

"Educate, Organize and Agitate" was a dynamic message given by Dr. B. R. Ambedkar to all the deprived classes for their social development. After the Conversion of Buddhism in 1956 there was an upsurge of revolution of Ambedkarism in the nation. Education is the only source for the upliftment of the depressed and oppressed class and I owe something to Society, following these ideals Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik established the Peoples Welfare Society in 1967. The visionaries like Dr. Balraj Aher, Justice R. R. Bhole, Shri A.D. Meshram, Dr. Sankale and Shri Wamanrao Gedam fathomed the acute need of higher education facilities in the North Nagpur and it was only due to their foresightedness that Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik P.W.S. College was established in 1968 near Indora Square at Kampette Road with a few students in this area. Since the establishment the college has brought social awakening among its neighboruing locality and has hleped a lot to build the career and prosper their lives to the students from marganized society living in the North Region. The People's Welfare Society enlarged its scope and established another centre of higher education in Kalmeshwar in Nagpur district under the name Indira Gandhi Arts and Commerce Collge in 1984 to facilitate the opprotunities of higher education to the rural students. Keeping in mind the acute need of advanced English learning for children in this area the People's Welfare Society also took initiative to start a CBSE Public School in 2014-15 entitled as Nagpur Public School to provide Hi-tech education in affordable expenses.

The college first won the Nagpur University Hockey Championship in 1972 under the stewardship of Dr. Balraj Aher, the former Registrar of R.T.M. Nagpur University the foundation Principal of the college and Prof. Narvariya, the then teacher in the Department of Physical Education. Since then a strong tradition of Sports, National Service Scheme. National Cadet Corps, and Extra curricular activities exist. The considerable Number of students of the college regularly feature in the University

Merit Lists for their academic excellence and also bring laurels in sports and extra curricular activities. The college hosted the first Akhil Bhartiya Dalit Sahitya Sammelan in 1976 under the able guidance of Dr. Madhukarrao Wasnik along with Dr. Yeshwant Manohar and the Bhavu Lokhande. The college has National Service Scheme Unit of 200 volunteers which is one of oldest National Service Scheme Unit of the R.T.M. Nagpur University which has made its mark on the face of the times with their state and national level achievements.

The college NSS unit always documents a huge students participation in A Dhamma Sandesh from Diskhaboomi, a social Campaign held on Every Dhamma Chakara Paravartan Din since last decade. With the trust and co-operation from its learners the small sapling which was planted by Dr Madhukarrao Wasnik in 1968 has now turned into a gigantic tree in the form of a big Campus at kamptee road, catering to the needs of education and employment of the poor and backward students in this region It provides multi facilities to its learners, a big building with spacious class rooms, digital class rooms, PhD Research Centre, well equipped library with separate reading rooms for students, staff and Research scholars, a big computer lab, language lab, modern gymnasium, Siddharth Auditorium for academic deliberations and cultural activities, big play ground, canteen and a lush green beautiful garden till the date, the college has contributed to the university with more than 40,000 skilled graduates and post graduates who have added feathers in the cap of institution with their achievements in academics, sports, NSS, NCC and cultural wings. A large number of alumnae are working in various fields as high rank government officials and are acknowledged as renowned artists, industrialists and businessmen in India and abroad Since its establishment, the college has been pioneer in various social movements and has played a pivotal role in enhancing the intellectual prosperity of the poor and needy Till the date the college has efficiently faced three NAAC assessment cycles and it has been reaccredited with B+ by NAAC for its academic achievements in its third cycle in 2017.

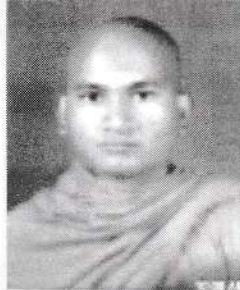

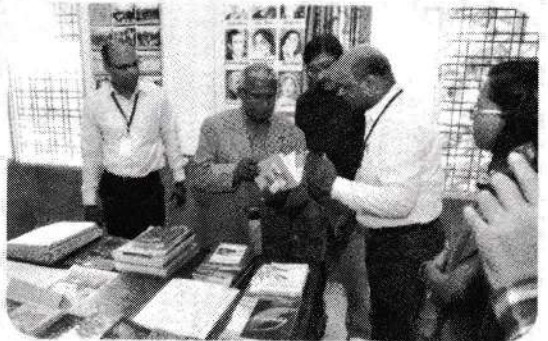

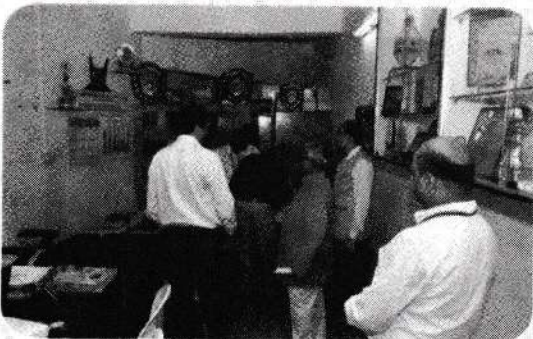

DMWPWS is committed to the overall development of the students. As responsible citizens we nurture the sense of responsibility and patriotism among the students. The college staff makes generous donations and undertakes social service projects to help the poor and needy. DMWPWS celebrates 24 September, NSS Foundation Day as Sankalp Divas. The various social Activities as Blood Donation Camp, Tree plantation, Orphanage Visit, Rally, Street Plays, Shram Dan etc. are organized on this day at the initiative of the students and teachers of the college.

DMWPWS adopted Kawtha, a village in the near by area. The college documents a huge students participation in Dhamma Chakra Pravartan Day food Donation Programme and other community help services.

Other College Activities and Schemes
